



Your chamber facilitates international trade:

As a Gettysburg Adams Chamber of Commerce member, you can obtain free **Certificates of Origin** from the chamber office to facilitate international trade. These important international trade documents certify that goods in a particular export shipment are wholly obtained, produced, manufactured or processed in a particular country. They also

serve as a declaration by the exporter. Virtually every country in the world considers the origin of imported goods when determining the duty that will be applied or, in some cases, whether the goods may be legally imported at all. The chamber is the key agent of delivery of these international trade documents.

ACNB Bank recently reported its third guarter earnings at \$1.91 million. The figure represents a 30 percent drop from the previous year because of acquisition expenses for New Windsor State Bank. Without the acquisition expenses, the bank would have brought in \$4.65 million, a 68 percent increase over last year. Other earnings include \$1.2 billion in loans, a 42 percent increase; \$1.3 billion in deposits, a 36 percent increase; and \$1.6 billion in assets.

Belco Community Credit Union Senior Vice President and Big Brothers Big Sisters of the Capital Region Board Chairman Paul Perini III rappelled from Market Street Plaza in Harrisburg to raise \$1,750 in donations for the Big Brothers Big Sisters of the Capital Region Over the Edge fundraiser. 




