Celebrating the 15th Year of the Environmental Stewardship Award

The Environmental Stewardship Award was given to the Adams Rescue Mission (ARM) on February 14, at the General Membership Breakfast held at Hoffman Homes for Youth. The purpose of the award is to recognize organizations for the measures they take to preserve and protect the environmental resources of Adams County.

The ARM has provided free recycling services to Adams County for the past 40 years, and curbside pickup for 12 years. They are currently the only drop off point that is approved by the Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) in

The ARM started an Electronics Recycling Collection point for the county in September 2010, and has recycled 220.02 tons of e-waste electronics, and work with a company called e-Loop, LLC. It's estimated that in Pennsylvania, 29.2 million pounds of e-waste was diverted

from landfills, and e-Loop has collected 5 million pounds of that. The facility will accept a wide variety of electronics for FREE including: televisions, desktop and laptop computers, monitors and printers, stereos, toasters, coffee makers, etc.

Congratulations to the Adams Rescue Mission for continuing efforts on proper recycling standards and helping to keep Adams County and Pennsylvania a better place to live.

From the Desk of... the Chamber President



As most of you know, the Chamber has partnered with Junior Achievement (JA) to help promote their Our Community curriculum to the school districts in Adams County. This program explores the interdependent roles of workers in a community, the work they perform and how communities work. What's great is that JA has taken the time to understand the state requirements and has incorporated them into the program to help teachers meet those goals.

So, what is the Chamber's role in this partnership? We have helped the JA representatives make connections with all six school districts in Adams County to explain the program and determine their interest. Gettysburg Area School District is implementing the program this spring in all nine of their second grade classes and Upper Adams School District will be start the program in the fall of the next school year. Several others are considering including it in the next school year.

Additionally, the Chamber has asked that members consider making a contribution to JA to help cover the costs of administration of the programs here and the costs for background checks and materials.

What I would like to ask you to consider now, is serving as a volunteer in the classrooms to deliver the program. Volunteers are asked to participate in a training session that will be held in the Chamber office and to be able to commit to five 45-minute sessions of classroom time with the students. What's great about this opportunity is that you are paired with a teacher and you work out the volunteer schedule based on your needs. Please contact me at carries@gettysburg-chamber.org, if this is something you would enjoy doing at either Gettysburg or Biglerville elementary schools, or if you have any questions about the curriculum. No specific skill sets are required to volunteer and all materials are provided to you.

Tax season is upon us and your ever handy smart phone can help to take some of the pressure off you this year!

With the help of CNN Money we are going to help you go from organizing to tracking your refund in four easy steps!

Step 1 - Get Organized with Shoeboxed

Instead of stuffing receipts in a shoebox throughout the year, you can simply take photos of them and store them in an online account using the "Shoeboxed" app. Once receipts are downloaded, they are sorted by date and archived into spending. You can then search for specific expenses and when claiming deductions at tax time.

Step 2 - Find Credits with EITC Finder

Considering that we dole out an average of 29% of our income in taxes to Uncle Sam, you don't want to miss out on a single credit -- especially one that could result in a lucrative payout. The Earned Income Tax Credit, which gives up to \$5,700 to workers earning income under \$49,000, is one of the most commonly overlooked credits. Step 3 - Time to file with H&R Block At Home 1040EZ

When you finally have everything organized, you can file your taxes straight to the IRS without going to a preparer or even using a computer. Just take a photo of your W-2 with your smartphone, and your data will be uploaded into the application. You then simply review the form, enter some basic information about yourself and you're ready to e-file. The app is designed for simple returns involving a 1040EZ form, so it's perfect if you're single with income of less than \$80,000 or married with a combined income of less than \$100,000. But the app won't work if you have a more complicated return -- meaning your income exceeds these amounts, you have dependents or you own real estate, for example

Step 4 - Track your refund with IRS2go

You're done the painful part, now you just have to wait for your refund to arrive. If you get antsy, download the IRS's free app, IRS2go, to see if the IRS received and processed your return. If it has, the app will tell you when you should expect to receive your check.
