

"When Good Leaders Lose Their Way"



The keynote speaker is Mark Whitacre who came to public attention in 1995 when, as president of the BioProducts Division at Archer Daniels Midland (ADM), he was the highest-level corporate executive in U.S. history to become an FBI whistleblower.
