



# Land Conservancy of Adams County Preserving Our Rural Lands and Character

Who we are: In the 1980s, Adams County's beautiful open spaces, farmlands, woodlands and lower tax rates began attracting folks who wanted to live here. Suddenly, land that had been farmland or woodland for generations was threatened by unplanned development. While this growth was welcomed by some, it concerned many who wanted to preserve Adams County's rural character while integrating development thoughtfully.


Adams County's growing land conservation movement led to the founding in 1995 of the Land Conservancy of Adams County, a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization accredited by the Land Trust Alliance. We work to preserve the farmlands, forests, streams and open spaces that make this such an appealing place to live and visit.

**What we do:** The Land Conservancy collaborates with interested landowners to preserve their land through conservation easements—voluntary legal agreements tailored to the landowner's wishes and attached to the property title that specify the kind and amount of development the landowner wants to allow on the property, both now and in perpetuity. To date we have worked with more than 100 Adams County landowners to preserve more than 9,000 acres of land through 132 easements. We look forward to reaching our goal of preserving 10,000 acres as we approach our 20<sup>th</sup> anniversary in 2015.

**Won't you join us?** With only two paid staffers, the Land Conservancy operates, in large part, through the work of members and volunteers who contribute time and talents in many meaningful ways, helping keep our overhead low. In fact, more than 95 percent of every dollar we receive in revenue goes directly toward our mission. Members help support our mission financially, too. Becoming a member starts at just \$35. Visit our website for more information.

And have some fun! The Land Conservancy's Road Rally is one if our most popular annual fundraisers. This year's Rally is set for Saturday, Oct. 18. The theme is "The Churches of Adams County," and participants will visit our picturesque churches, graveyards, church schools, camps and more.
