From the Desk of the... Chamber President

The chamber and Adams County Economic Education Foundation co-hosted the Business Education Summit last month. Its purpose was to introduce business leaders to the challenges faced by educators in preparing our future workforce and to acquaint school administrators with the workforce needs of local businesses.

No matter where you stand on the Keystone Exams and the need for teachers to "teach to the test," one fact remains: students need additional support when it comes to being the best prepared they can be in becoming our future employees. We can continue to place blame, or we can work together to make great things happen.

Dr. Larry Redding, Gettysburg Area School District, kicked off the event with a State of Education presentation, then Representative Will Tallman set the stage for the summit.



Five small group roundtables were formed with representatives from our local school districts and top employers. With the help of trained facilitators, groups brainstormed and prioritized needs and walked away from the event with action plans to begin addressing at least one major need per district.

Some of the next steps that came out of the summit:

- To better understand the skills needed by local businesses, one district will develop a Business Advisory Group that will meet on a regular basis to address the skills gap.
- A business offered to come to schools to conduct mock interviews with students.
- Another district is conducting a survey of local businesses to determine the interest in and availability of job shadowing opportunities. The school will also develop a list of business leaders to talk to classes.
- One district is hosting a tour of their facilities for district leaders to see first-hand the type of equipment students are learning on, which may be outdated in some industry standards.

In the end, the summit showed the need for business and industry representatives to become more active participants in the education process. Educators are open to this prospect and our communities will be better for it. Having a prepared and skilled workforce will help with the retention of our businesses and support the recruitment of new businesses to Adams County in commercial growth areas.



Gettysburg Community Theatre opened in 2009 to inspire creativity and confidence, provide cultural enrichment, and instill a love of the theatre arts in the young and young at heart through quality education, training and performing experiences in musical theatre.

We are fortunate to be embraced with our community's support of this non-profit 501(c)3 volunteer community theatre. We strive to continue reaching more people in Gettysburg, and beyond Adams County as well, so that more can come see the great work that goes on inside this beautiful historic building at 49 York Street in downtown Gettysburg (the old Elks Lodge).

The theatre typically has 10-15 productions per year including productions for youth actors, senior citizen actors, and adults of all ages, as well as an annual production featuring youth with special needs as the stars.

Ticket sales only cover about 40% of our annual operating budget. This is the norm for most nonprofit community theatres across the country, according to national studies over the last decade. The theatre also has an educational component, and with tuition and ticket sales together, is able to cover about 60% of our annual operating budget. Like most nonprofits, we rely heavily on donations

from patrons of the arts and corporate/business sponsors that wish to sponsor a show or season and also receive great advertising opportunities.



Adams County Career Fair Connects 1,100 High School Students to Local Experts

More than 1,100 Adams County tenth grade students learned how to reach their career goals during the 15th annual Adams County Career Fair at Gettysburg College on Wednesday, March 11.

Hosted by the Adams County Economic Education Foundation with support from the Gettysburg Adams Chamber of Commerce and Gettysburg College, the day-long event served students from all six Adams County public school districts, two private schools and Lincoln Intermediate Unit #12.

"Our schools are doing a great job of teaching the fundamentals of education, and the career fair is one of the many ways our business community is adding to that foundation," said Carrie Stuart, the foundation's executive director. "The career fair helps students chart their path from high school to career with sound advice from seasoned professionals. Giving students these experiences beyond the walls of the classroom helps create an environment where our students, businesses and communities thrive."

Students selected three careers of their choosing, from about 60 offerings, to learn about during workshops led by local business leaders. Career speakers explained the classes students might need in high school, what degrees are needed and the avenues to follow for further training or schooling. The speakers also helped the students understand what it is like to perform a job on a daily basis. For many students, this was their only chance to speak to someone who works in their field of interest.

"We thank the many volunteers from our community who take the time to participate in the career fair. Some of them have been involved for years and have influenced hundreds of youth on their career choices," added Stuart.

The top careers chosen by students this year were law enforcement, medical, military, food prep/culinary arts, teaching and early childhood education, and automotive technician/mechanic. New careers represented included interpreter/ translator and human resources.

The non-profit Adams County Economic Education Foundation bridges the gap between the business and education communities to prepare students for higher education and the workforce. More than 30,000 students in Adams County have benefited since 1991.




