community," said Gettysburg Adams Chamber of Commerce President Carrie Stuart. "The chamber thanks these outstanding award winners, and the entire local business community, for their many contributions to keeping Adams County strong, viable and growing."

Isaac Bucher and his wife Nicole are third generation owners of Mister Ed's Elephant Museum & Candy Emporium, a successful candy store, gift shop and elephant museum since 1975. Isaac served as general manager before purchasing the business from his wife's grandparents in July 2014. Under his leadership, Mister Ed's has expanded its outposts in the Gettysburg area to eight, started successful fudge fundraising campaigns for school and community groups, and grown the market for special event candy buffets. Isaac has also helped increase revenue through marketing campaigns and by introducing new homemade products like truffles and cinnamon glazed nuts. He initiated two free community events: the annual Easter Egg Hunt and Santa Claus arrival, with a combined nearly 1,000 attendees. Isaac served as chair for the chamber's 2015 Taste of the Town, is a member of Adams County Young Professionals and Lower Marsh Creek Presbyterian Church, and is a community volunteer.

Stacey Green has grown her food business from a small truck stop restaurant to a successful catering company with 15 years of service to the community. Biggerstaff's Catering currently holds the food service contract for the Lutheran Theological Seminary at Gettysburg, where her staff of five works from the Refectory to provide daily lunch specials for students and staff and cater private and corporate events. She has found new and innovative ways to succeed in the competitive business, adding a "Quiz Night" to the monthly agenda, where the community can enjoy a meal and trivia, and a "Bistro Night," which gives families the opportunity to purchase meals to put in the freezer for later use. Actively involved in the community, Stacey sits on the boards of the Gettysburg Adams Chamber of Commerce, Gettysburg Hospital Foundation, Adams County Community Foundation and Gettysburg Borough Zoning Hearing Board, and is a supporter of many other organizations. *Continued next page...*

Nearly 600 rabbittransit customers surveyed say they are satisfied with the services

offered by the regional public transportation provider. On a five point scale ranging from 1, very dissatisfied, to 5, very satisfied, 85.1% of riders gave a rating of 4 or 5. Eighty-nine percent of riders will definitely continue using rabbittransit. An indication of the important role played by the transportation system is the 58.2% of riders who reported the service is critical to gaining and keeping a job and 21.7% who said the service is important in their pursing a higher education.

A book chronicling the history of Adams **Electric Cooperative** and authored by two Gettysburg residents has won a gold award from the National Rural Electric Cooperative Association's Council of Rural Electric Communicators. "The Fight for Power: An electric cooperative changes south central Pennsylvania forever" was



selected as part of the council's 2015 Spotlight on Excellence awards. Co-authors Jim Krut and Duane Kanagy spent more than two years researching and writing the 136-page work. It is available at any Adams Electric office.





Adams County High School Seniors Recognized for Self Improvement

The Adams County Economic Education Foundation and Dwight D. Eisenhower Society honored senior students who demonstrated significant improvement over the course of their high school careers with the Senior Self Improvement Award during a breakfast on April 30.

The award, given to up to five students from each of Adams County's six school districts, recognizes students who improved their grades, attitudes, attendance, behavior and service to others while in high school.

"We're pleased to honor these high school seniors, each of whom have overcome adversity to become good students and make the best of their education," said Adams County Economic Education Foundation Executive Director Carrie Stuart. "These award winners are our future workforce, and any local business would be fortunate to employ them because of their strong work ethic, determination and growth."

Rosa Ana Nunez-Lua was also awarded the Resiliency Award, which recognizes a student who, despite significant obstacles, maintains an outstanding academic record.

Five students from each school district are eligible for the award. The selection committee considers a completed application, past and present report cards, attendance and discipline records, two letters of recommendation, a written statement by the student and a brief description of service to others. The top performer from each district is awarded \$500, while runners up receive \$100. The students may spend the money as they wish.

The non-profit Adams County Economic Education Foundation bridges the gap between the business and education communities to prepare students for higher education and the workforce. More than 30,000 students in Adams County have benefited since 1991.


Destination Gettysburg Tells Tourism Story


Main Street Welcomes Business Liaison Manager


