Celebrating August Produce Month

The Gettysburg Adams Chamber of Commerce will join other community partners and Agriculture Secretary Russell Redding later this month to celebrate August as Produce Month in Pennsylvania.

We'll mark the occasion at the Adams County Farm Fresh Market, which has moved from its location at the Gettysburg Heritage Center to the bordering Culp Street Wednesday afternoons from 2-6 p.m. During the event,



we'll cut the ribbon on the market's new location, which pairs perfectly the county's two leading economic drivers – agriculture and tourism. We'll also recognize the market's expansion of nutrition assistance programs, healthy living through cooking demonstrations and the revitalization of Steinwehr Avenue.

Farmers markets have grown in popularity and cropped up in every community across the nation as consumers want to know the answers to food production questions like who, when, where and how.

We're fortunate here in Adams County to have many amazing places to pull off the road, explore the local bounty and build meaningful connections with the people who produce our food and form the backbone of our community.

Farmers markets are one option, with wineries, farm stands, retail stores and restaurants adding to the possibilities. These businesses are helping people prepare and enjoy affordable, fresh and nutritious meals for their families using products that have earned Adams County a reputation for quality. At the same time these businesses are working to feed our bodies, they are nourishing our local economy.

Many of our farmers markets are answering the call to help those with limited access to quality, healthy food. Citizens at risk for hunger can enjoy fresh produce with assistance from the Farmers Market Nutrition Program (FMNP) for older adults and those enrolled in the Women, Infant and Children (WIC) program, as well as through the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) for low-wage working families, low-income seniors and people with disabilities living on fixed incomes.

Adams County Farm Fresh Markets is going above and beyond to ensure our most vulnerable citizens have access to fresh produce. Now FMNP and SNAP participants get double benefits at the markets on Culp Street and at The Outlet Shoppes at Gettysburg Fridays and Saturdays. For example, \$20 in FMNP vouchers are now equal to \$40.

EVENT DETAILS: Join us for the August Produce Month celebration on Wednesday, Aug. 12. The market will host special activities from 2-6 p.m., with a ribbon cutting at 3:30 p.m. and chamber member open house from 4-6 p.m. Come enjoy the special activities and take home some of Adams County's bounty to enjoy.

Adams County Winery released its fourth wine of the summer, Just Giggles, a red wine Sangria. The wine is packaged in a bright colored 1.5 liter Astrapouch (equivalent to two bottles of wine). The pouch is a grab-and-go, disposable, eco-friendly pouch with a 80-percent less carbon imprint on the environment than glass, water submersible, non-glass packaging system for beverages.

Adams Electric Cooperative Inc. Lighting the Way for 75 Years

In 1940, a group of community members joined together to create Adams Electric Cooperative, bringing light to rural areas that never had electricity before.

Now, 75 years later, the cooperative is still fulfilling its mission of bringing safe, reliable power at competitive rates to rural areas of south central Pennsylvania, including Adams, Cumberland, Franklin, Perry and York counties.

The final portion of the co-op's mission statement is to, "improve the quality of life in the communities it serves." Toward that end, Adams Electric offers many member and community benefits, including high school and adult scholarships, resource conservation loans, community development loans, youth programs, and a Project Helping Hand (PHH) member assistance program.

For more than 25 years, PHH has helped keep the lights on for members in need. Nearly 5,000 Adams Electric members donate each year to PHH and help their fellow members make their electric bill payments. As many as 500 members are helped each year.

In 2015, the cooperative hopes to increase awareness of PHH by hosting the first annual Light the Way 5K. The trail-style walk/run will be held on Sunday, Oct. 18, at the Gettysburg Area Senior High School as part of the annual Cooperative Month celebration.

Festivities begin at 9 a.m. on the school's cross country course. Registration is now open and the cost is \$30 per participant. More information can be found at adamsec. coop/content/light-way.


