

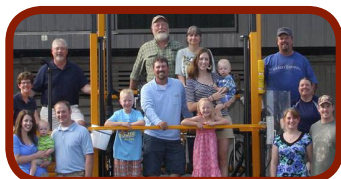

Spend a fantastic fall weekend Sept. 12-13 at the Gateway Gettysburg Complex. Savor the flavors of hundreds of Pennsylvania wines and enjoy rocking bands.

Pennsylvania's moderate climate and rolling hills provide some of the best grape growing conditions on the East Coast, and the state's production and reputation for quality wines is growing. This festival is your chance to traverse seven acres rather than hundreds of miles to taste some of the best wines from every corner of the state -- all at one fun, festive and relaxed event.

Attendees can sample and purchase wine from 25 Pennsylvania wineries, enjoy offerings from more than 50 food and craft vendors and dance to the region's best live music. The event annually draws nearly 7,000 attendees.

Hosted by the Gettysburg Adams Chamber of Commerce and supported by area businesses and hundreds of volunteers, the festival promotes Pennsylvania wine, boosts the area economy and strengthens the local quality of life. In addition to supporting programs of the Gettysburg Adams Chamber of Commerce, the festival benefits community organizations with more than \$10,000 in donations. Business News

The Robert C. Hoffman Charitable Endowment Trust received the prestigious Philanthropy Recognition award from the Statewide Adoption and Permanency Network. **Adams County Children and Youth** nominated the Hoffman Trust for being an essential contributor to the independent living services over the past few years, funding a temporary housing program for homeless youth. In 2014, the trust funded nearly \$300,000 of local projects.

Adams Electric Cooperative Inc. recently presented the local chapter of the **American Red Cross** with two checks totaling \$10,000. The money donated is in support of the Heroes Program, which recognizes local individuals for their heroic and selfless acts performed in either Adams, Franklin, Fulton or York Counties. Adams Electric will also help reduce the number of fire injuries and fatalities by partnering with the Red Cross in bringing the Home Fire Preparedness Campaign to the area. Teams of Red Cross volunteers will canvas communities, installing smoke detectors and delivering fire prevention information to local residents.

Melissa Ferguson was recently named General Manager of the **Country Inn and Suites by Carlson** in Gettysburg. She previously served as Assistant General Manager/Director of Sales at the property. The 83-room property is located next to **The Outlet Shoppes at Gettysburg**.

Karen Land joins the staff of **Gettysburg Community Theatre** where she will teach improvisational acting. Land has a 28-year career in the theatre and teaches master classes in directing, auditioning, acting, musical theatre and Zenprov (improv with zen philosophies). Improvisational classes at the theater begin after labor day and conclude in November with a showcase. Classes are Mondays from 6-8 p.m. for adults and college students, Tuesdays from 4-6 p.m. for ages 55+, Tuesdays 6-8 p.m. for teens ages 13-18 and Wednesdays from 6-8 p.m. for kids ages 8-12.

Beginning with the fall term, all **HACC** campuses are now tobacco free. That means HACC students, employees and the community are no longer able to light up, chew or inhale tobacco products in the classrooms and offices, campus grounds or parking lots. The new policy is the culmination of the work of college employees and students who joined together in a wellness coalition.

For the first time in the 51-year history of **HACC** six students are receiving full-ride merit scholarships. HACC will fund two years of these individuals' education – enough to complete an associate degree. The Gettysburg Campus recipient is Nathan Tasker of Hanover, who wrote in his essay he wanted to "graduate from college without debt... to lay the groundwork for a home where my children will not be burdened by the same financial difficulties by which others have been bound." The scholarship was created by the HACC Foundation and covers tuition, books and fees, approximately \$25,000 per student.

Hollabaugh Bros. Inc. Fruit Farm & Market recently celebrated its 60th anniversary. Twin brothers Donald and Harold began growing and selling processing apples in 1955

and operated a small roadside stand where passers-by could purchase the farm's homegrown fruit, just across the road from its current location. In 1962 retail operations moved across the street to a new store, where the family marketed their produce for 50 years. In 2012 they opened a new market with larger retail space, a bakery, ice cream window, large tour facilities and a large parking lot.

The Historic Preservation Society of Gettysburg-Adams County recently awarded its annual Barn Preservation Award to the **Littlestown Veterinary Hospital**. The hospital barn building was constructed sometime between 1860 and 1880 and was rehabilitated in 1998 as a pottery shop. Doctors Julie Holland and Gary Kubala purchased the building in 2008 and carefully renovated it into a veterinary hospital while maintaining the barn beam and ladder features. The building is home to other businesses and also features solar panels on the roof.

Zach Erdman of Camp Hill has been named Account Executive of **Members 1st Federal Credit Union's** York and Adams territory. He is responsible for business development and sales. He is a graduate of West Chester University where he earned his degree in Finance.

Mission of Mercy CEO Jennifer Charlton was recognized recently at the 2015 Baltimore Brava Awards. Charlton has served as Mission of Mercy's director since 2012 and presided over the organization's capital campaign, which has raised \$450,000 for medical programs and the purchase of a new mobile medical unit. She also oversaw the successful launch of the Community Connections program that connects patients with community resources.

rabbittransit earned a national safety certification recently, with COO Michael Devaney becoming a Certified Safety and Security Officer for the organization. The certification helps improve the professional preparedness of public and community transportation officers and maximize their ability to provide safe and secure transit services.

Destination Gettysburg Launches 'Bring It Home' Campaign

Destination Gettysburg has launched a new initiative to encourage local organizations, associations and citizens to bring meetings and conventions to Adams County.

The "Bring It Home" program is an incentive to inspire local groups and individuals to work with the organizations of which they are involved into bringing those organizations to Adams County. The focus of the program is meetings, events and annual conferences. Such conferences and organizations include military groups, religious conferences, sporting events and corporate meetings, among others.

In return for bringing a qualified meeting to Adams County, Destination Gettysburg is offering these organizations an incentive of \$500 toward the cost of an opening reception to their conferences or events.

Qualified meetings include those that generate a minimum of a two-night stay, Thursday through Sunday in Adams County, 80 total room nights, booked between now and Dec. 31, 2015 and occurring before Dec. 31, 2016. Additionally, the organization or meeting planner must be a resident of Adams County.

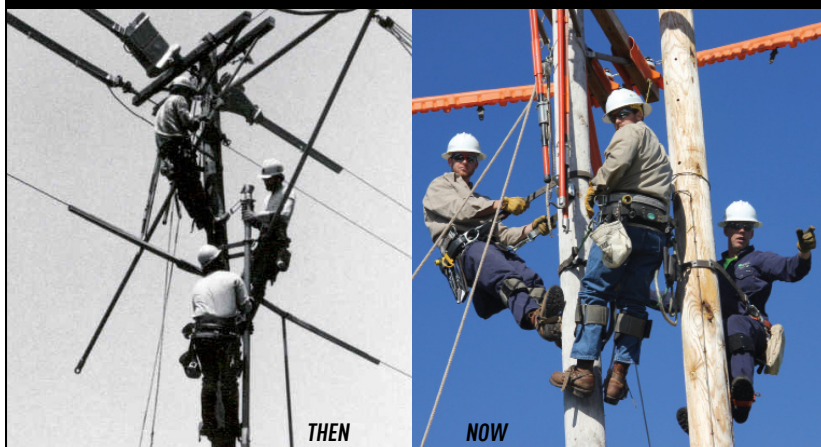
