Chamber Holds Legislative Forum

Nearly 100 chamber members discussed business and community issues with local legislators during the chamber's annual State Legislative Luncheon on Friday, March 11, at the HACC-Gettysburg Campus.

Moderated by *Gettysburg Times* editor Alex Hayes, Senator Rich Alloway and Representatives Dan Moul and Will Tallman fielded questions from the audience ranging from potential mandated minimum wage increases to cider production.



Passing a Sustainable State Budget

Not surprisingly, the state budget crisis and pension reform were the main topics of discussion. Pennsylvania has been without a budget since July 1, 2015, despite five budgets being passed out of the House and seven attempts at a budget or compromise by the Senate.

Representative Moul said Republicans in both bodies of the General Assembly believe no budget can be sustainable without addressing pension reform. There is currently \$60 billion in debt in the state's pension systems, a number that grows daily. He said a hybrid plan that combines a traditional pension with 401K does not go far enough to get the system out of debt; instead new hires should be under a 401K plan only.

Funding Our Schools

Several school board members representing many of the county's public school districts were in attendance and questioned why legislators and the Governor could not come together on a budget compromise. Some of the districts are looking at borrowing money to keep the schools open.

Representative Tallman said he is seeking ways to improve the way money is distributed to school districts in the budget. The Basic Education Funding Commission created a school funding formula in 1991 that has not been used in a decade. The commission developed a new formula that if used today, of the 17 schools in Adams and Cumberland counties, only one would fare worse; the rest would be better off using this formula versus what has been proposed in the Governor's budget.

Making it Easier to Do Business

Following the Governor's recent Executive Action to increase the minimum wage from \$7.25 per hour to \$10.10 per hour for state employees and state contractors, business owners are concerned that this paves the path for a mandatory statewide minimum wage increase. The legislators agreed the government should not tell employers what to pay their employees. Senator Alloway noted if a bill should pass the legislature and be signed into law, he is prepared to introduce a tax break for small businesses.

Another attendee asked what legislators are doing to make it easier to open and operate a cider business. The panelists voiced their support in moving the cider industry forward and suggested that anyone running into challenges contact their legislators.

Businesses in New Oxford are looking forward to renovations to the town's square, which will help improve its appearance and traffic flow. Senator Alloway said the project is a priority for him, but the Governor is holding the funds as a bargaining chip in budget negotiations, despite there being money already set aside and available.

The event was sponsored by Adams Electric Cooperative Inc. with support from C.S. Davidson Inc. and Harrisburg International Airport. Table sponsors were School Express Inc. and Land and Sea Services. The South Central Community Action Program's Food Service Development Program, which teaches students food service skills so they can become more employable, provided a catered lunch.







Adams County Career Fair Connects 1,100 High School Students to Local Experts

More than 1,100 Adams County tenth grade students today learned how to reach their career goals during the 16th annual Adams County Career Fair at Gettysburg College.

Hosted by the Adams County Economic Education Foundation with support from the Gettysburg Adams Chamber of Commerce and Gettysburg College, the day-long event served students from all six Adams County public school districts, two private schools and Lincoln Intermediate Unit #12.

"Our schools are doing a great job of teaching the fundamentals of education, and the career fair is one of the many ways our business community is adding to that foundation," said Carrie Stuart, the foundation's executive director. "The career fair helps students chart their path from high school to career with sound advice from seasoned professionals. Giving students these experiences beyond the walls of the classroom helps create an environment where our students, businesses and communities thrive."

Students selected three careers of their choosing, from about 60 offerings, to learn about during workshops led by local business leaders. Career speakers explained the classes students might need in high school, what degrees are needed and the avenues to follow for further training or schooling. The speakers also helped the students understand what it is like to perform a job on a daily basis. For many students, this was their only chance to speak to someone who works in their field of interest.

The top careers chosen by students this year were law enforcement, medical, military, food prep/culinary arts, teaching and early childhood education, and automotive technician/mechanic.

The non-profit Adams County Economic Education Foundation bridges the gap between the business and education communities to prepare students for higher education and the workforce. More than 35,000 students in Adams County have benefited since 1991.



Business & Education Summit Brings Educators, Business Community Together

The Adams County Economic Education Foundation recently partnered with the chamber to co-host the second annual Business Education Summit. All six of Adams County's public school district superintendents and various educators and business leaders were in attendance.

Following presentations by Dr. Russell Greenholt, superintendent of Conewago Valley School District, on changing trends in the education systems around the world, and Kevin Perky, executive director of South Central PA Works, on education and labor trends in the region, business leaders and district officials broke into small groups. Each group identified potential areas that needed attention, or issues where better communication and cooperation is needed.

The small group discussions allowed educators to hear what other districts are doing to address student needs with respect to career preparation. Additionally, business leaders were better able to understand how they can help in the education process.

Several ideas were presented for consideration during the large group discussion, including:

- Better and increased summer job opportunities for students. This is a time where employers can

take the time to identify workplace expectations and mentor youth, thus setting the stage for their future work ethic.

- Creating videos or commercials of various industries so students can better understand what jobs are available to them and parents can understand how things like technology advancements have changed the work environment.

The chamber's Business & Industry Team, along with attendees of the summit will work together over the coming months to vet these and other suggestions and prioritize activities for the coming year. Main Street Gettysburg Restructures

Two new directors were elected to the Main Street Gettysburg Board of Directors at their Feb. 24 meeting. Peter Monahan, owner of Federal Pointe Inn, and Wendy Allen, owner of Lincoln Into Art were elected to a three-year term.

"The MSG Board realized that in order to achieve the 10-Year Economic Strategy Plan, adopted in 2015, the organization needed to recruit more representatives from the business communities committed to investing both in the borough projects and the MSG organization and to restructure the board," said Emmett Patterson, chair of Main Street Gettysburg and local business owner.

The restructuring includes a Governing Board and a new Community Advisory Committee, as well as groups that represent the four major areas for economic growth: Steinwehr Avenue, Baltimore Street Chambersburg/York and Carlisle streets, including Lincoln Square. The responsibilities of the Governing Board of Directors will be the traditional role to determine the mission of the organization, establish management policies and procedures, assure that adequate human resources and financial resources are available, and actively monitor the organization's financial, personnel and programmatic performance.

The Community Advisory Committee will be an economic development advisory group that meets a minimum of three times a year, and provides a community-wide venue to discuss economic topics. The make-up of the committee will include a wide range of business and organizational leaders, including the chamber, that are looking to work collaboratively and will focus on sharing information and initiating new ideas to improve the economic health of Gettysburg. The purpose and agenda of this group will be to update the community representatives about the MSG projects and programs, and likewise to seek updates from the community about their own initiatives that impact the economic health of the community.


