The new location features drive-up teller, drive-up ATM, night depository services, and commercial, residential and consumer lending activities.

Adams County Economic Development Corporation honored the legacy of **Mason Dixon Farm's** Richard "Dick" Waybright by dedicating an October Maple tree in his memory. The tree is located at the ACEDC headquarters, 1300 Proline Place, Gettysburg.

Adams County Commissioners recently approved \$240,000 for the **Adams County Habitat for Humanity**, funding they have approved since 1999. The Adams County Housing Committee reviews grant requests and makes recommendations to the Commissioners for allocation of funding from the Affordable Housing Trust Fund, which is set aside for projects that serve low to moderate income people. This spring 2016, Adams County Habitat for Humanity completed its 38th home and is in the planning stages for the next.

The **American Red Cross** appointed Jeri Sims as the new Chief Executive Officer for the Red Cross Central Pennsylvania Region. Sims comes to the Red Cross from the Community Arts Center in Williamsport, where she served as Assistant Executive Director and Director of Development since 2007. Sims is based out of the region's Harrisburg office.

Belco Community Credit Union's Scholarship Committee recently awarded five scholarships of \$1,000 each to student-members who excelled academically while giving

back to their communities through extracurricular involvement and community service. The scholarship winners were chosen in March and honored at Belco's annual meeting in April.

Gettysburg Dental Associates and **Just Kids** hosted its fifth annual Tooth Fairy Movie Event, giving out 630 free movie tickets and filling two theaters for a screening of Finding Dory. Children were able to watch the new movie plus meet the Tooth Fairy and enjoy popcorn, drinks and a goodie bag.

Hanover Hospital now offers EVAR aortic aneurysm repair as part of its expanded interventional heart and vascular services. The minimally invasive procedure involves a small incision in the groin through which a doctor places a stent and graft to support the aneurysm, reducing the risk of rupture.



Hanover Hospital's interim president and CEO for the past year has been named to the post on a full-time basis. Michael Gaskins will assume the full-time roll effective July 1. Since being named interim last July, Gaskins has guided Hanover Hospital toward a number of key achievements, including reaccreditation and recognition as a "Top Performer" by The Joint Commission, which accredits health-care organizations and programs in the U.S.; designation as one of the first hospitals to receive the Highmark Blue Distinction Center for Maternity Care; and, most recently, the offering of endovascular aneurysm repair for the first time to the hospital's Hanover-area community.

Metropolitan Edison Company (Met-Ed) filed a comprehensive distribution rate plan with the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission (PUC) on April 28 aimed at enhancing system reliability for Met-Ed's 560,000 customers. The proposal provides for ongoing maintenance and inspections for new equipment and facilities built over the past several years; increases tree trimming and vegetation management; updates equipment used by field staff to report system damage and downed trees; and updates

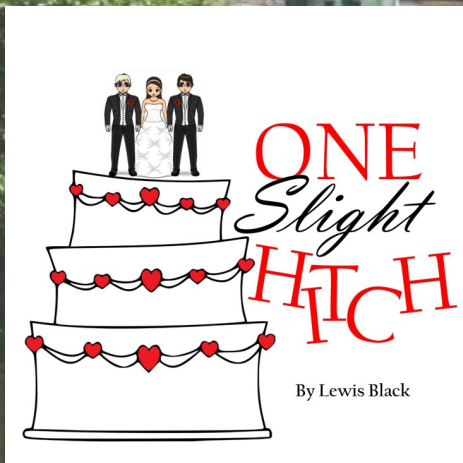

Member Spotlight

James Gettys Hotel: *Where History Meets Hospitality*

The James Gettys Hotel is located in historic downtown Gettysburg and offers sophistication, warm friendly hospitality and small town charm.

Listed on the National Register of Historic Places, the hotel looks as it did in the 1920s and provides your first taste of living history within history.

The founder of Gettysburg, James Gettys, sold his first plot of land to John Troxell Sr. in 1787. Troxell opened the Sign of the Buck Tavern and Roadhouse in 1804 to accommodate those traveling to the western frontier of Pennsylvania and beyond. Following the Battle of Gettysburg in 1863, the now Union Hotel served as a field hospital. By 1888, the City Hotel became a favorite of visitors to the Civil War battlefields and underwent expansion prior to the 25th anniversary of the battle. As transportation systems improved, the hotel thrived in the 1920's and 30's. The hotel closed in the 1960's and served as an apartment building until the 80's when it became an American Youth Hostel.

The hotel reopened in 1996 as the James Gettys Hotel, a suite-only boutique hotel.

Upon entering, you will step back in time. The James Gettys Hotel offers 12 tastefully appointed suites, each with a king or queen bed, private bath, sitting room and kitchenette. Cable television and free wifi are included in the suite, as is our complimentary continental breakfast served in-room. Free onsite parking is also available. The suite names represent significant businesses that existed within or near this building in the first 200 years of its existence: City Hotel, Union Hotel, Zeigler Holtzworth Livery, Blue Parrot Tearoom, Sign of the Buck, Indian King Inn, Sign of the Golden Cross Keys, Sign of the Spread Eagle, Keystone Hotel, Lord Nelson's, John Troxell Sr. and the Majestic.

Service at the James Gettys is provided by a trained staff that is well acquainted with both the historic features as well as the developing tourist attractions of the area.

After 20 years as part of the community, the hotel continues to work with local businesses, offering coffee roasted at the Ragged Edge Coffeehouse and homemade muffins and coffee cakes made with locally grown fruit.

TREYSTA Technology Management joined community and chamber leaders to cut the ribbon on a new expanded location at 55 North 5th St., Gettysburg.

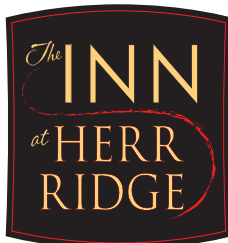

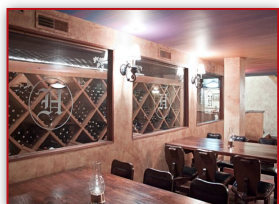

GARMA Plans for Major Christmas Update in 2016

The Gettysburg Area Retail Merchants Association (GARMA) is finalizing plans to retire the Christmas tree after 25 years of service on Lincoln Square and replace it with a new, environmentally friendly Christmas tree this year. The new tree will feature bright decorations, a grand tree topper and LED wiring. The tree will produce more vibrant light while using far less electricity than standard bulbs, dramatically reducing bulb maintenance due to the proven longevity of LED lights and simplifying wiring maintenance compared to the retired tree.

The replacement Christmas tree will match the height of the retired tree, and GARMA is coordinating with the Gettysburg Borough and its Public Works Department to ensure the new tree and all the amenities to support it on Lincoln Square are accounted for before the purchase is made.

GARMA will host a soon-to-be-announced community fundraising drive that will help make this dream become a reality for Christmas 2016.

YWCA Child Care Program Moving, Growing

This summer, the YWCA Child Care Program at Adams Commerce Center is moving to a new location: 50 Expedition Trail, behind Battlefield Kia just east of Gettysburg.

The new building was designed following best practices in the child care field, and the move will allow the YWCA to provide care for nearly 50 additional children. The center will continue to serve children ages 6 weeks to 12 years old, utilizing the Creative Curriculum and the Pennsylvania Early Learning Standards.

The increased number of classrooms will allow for smaller class sizes. The facility will house five classrooms for infant and toddler care, with no more than 12 children per room. Three classrooms for preschool will allow for separate space for 3- and 4-year-olds. The before- and after-school care programs will be able to accommodate 36 children with a much larger classroom, allowing for more designated learning centers with ample quiet space for completing homework.

Children's gross motor skills will be enhanced with the use of a 4,700-square-foot outdoor playground, designed with learning stations to encourage children's creativity and promote physical activity. When weather prevents children from going outdoors, they can use the new multi-purpose room. Staff will also have a separate room to use for lunch breaks, lesson planning, completing assignments and holding parent conferences. A storage room will offer more than just additional space for materials; it will also allow teachers to share resources between classrooms and create a small library for the children.
