Gettysburg Adams Chamber President Represents Local Businesses in Harrisburg

HARRISBURG – Gettysburg Adams Chamber of Commerce President Carrie Stuart joined chamber leaders in Harrisburg June 6 to discuss issues of importance to Pennsylvania’s business community with key policymakers.

More than 100 people attended the annual Chamber Day, hosted by the Pennsylvania Chamber of Business and Industry and the Pennsylvania Association of Chamber Professionals.

“Chamber Day provides a unique opportunity to put the top issues facing employers in the forefront as state lawmakers and legislative staff head into budget negotiations,” said Stuart. “Likewise, the day helps educate chamber leaders on the issues facing legislators. It’s a two way exchange with one focus – improving Pennsylvania’s business climate and competitive edge.”

The day-long event included presentations from Governor Tom Wolf, Secretary of State Pedro Cortes, Senate Pro Tempore Joseph Scarnati (R-Jefferson) and Speaker of the House Mike Turzai (R-Allegheny).

Attendees participated in policy discussions on a variety of topics, including: the upcoming 2017-18 state budget, pension reform, property taxes, workforce development and the state’s transportation and infrastructure needs.

Stuart said the chamber also maintains a good working relationship with Adams County’s legislative delegation to ensure members are represented in Harrisburg and Washington.
