Taste of the Town Donation Supports Career Education in Adams County

Gettysburg, Pa. – A portion of the proceeds from Adams County's culinary showcase, Taste of the Town, was recently donated to a local organization that helps prepare students for higher education and the workforce.

The annual event, hosted by the Gettysburg Adams Chamber of Commerce, features food tastings from area restaurants, bakeries, businesses and wineries in addition to live music and the popular Top Local Celebrity Chef Competition.

Committee members donated \$573 to the Adams County Economic Education Foundation. The non-profit bridges the gap between the business and education communities to prepare students for higher education and the workforce. More than 30,000 students have benefited since 1991 through programs like the annual Adams County Career Fair.
