

Let's meet Miranda Wisor with the Adams County Library System!

Miranda Wisor may be new to her position of Executive Director of the Adams County Library System, but she is no stranger to working within libraries. After graduating from Gettysburg College, where she started her career working in Musselman Library, she moved on to work in a library system with 17 libraries in Oklahoma and then moved to Virginia to be the System Director for a two county library system.

"My family has ties to Adams County. I started my career here. My husband and I started our family here," Wisor said, "So working at the Adams County Library System feels like coming full circle."

Growing up, Wisor always had a passion for reading, saying that her family would go to book stores and spend a lot of money instead of going to the toy store. It wasn't until she was an adult that she learned all the other possibilities a public library had to offer. "It seemed like the greatest cost savings in the world," Wisor said.

Along with the cost savings, the library system offers up a variety of programs and resources for the public. Wisor described the Adams County Library System as a community cultural center offering tons of programs at all six locations for people of all ages.

"Anything from story time for babies and toddlers through teen programming and adult lectures series," Wisor expanded. "We have a plethora of personal and educational growth opportunities and resources."

The best part is that all of this is available to the whole community, all you need is a **free** Adams County Library System Card. Being a free resource opens the library up to serve as an engagement point for people to connect to other people and for the community to come together.

Part of that community connection is the library working with other local nonprofits to better serve Adams County. One of Wisor's favorite partnership programs is the Living Library with the YWCA Gettysburg.

"It is such a neat concept to sit down one-onone with another person and to hear about their life experiences, someone you may never have talked to before and may never talk to again," she said.

Wisor is thankful for the opportunity to have worked in a lot of different libraries. She is proud that it is a profession that genuinely wants to help and support the communities that they are a part of.

What makes Adams County such a great place to be a part of?

Of all of the places I've lived, Adams County has by far the most amount of people who care about making where they live a good place to live. A lot of people in Adams County are willing to give of their time and talents to make sure that this is a positive and nice place to live.

ADVOCACY UPDATES

EDUCATION BUDGET BILL ADVANCES, WOULD WEAKEN SCHOOL CHOICE

With the June 30 state budget deadline just a few weeks away, the halls and hearing rooms of the state Capitol and the House and Senate chambers are buzzing with activity, and legislation expected to be part of the annual budget is starting to move.


Education funding accounts for more than one-third of total annual state spending. Each year, there is a struggle in the General Assembly to ensure education dollars are spent on educating our children, not creating new programs, padding salaries or propping up the state teachers' union.

The basic education funding bill before us does nothing to fix our failing education system or to support school choice. In fact, it cuts funding for cyber charter schools, which provides a lifeline to students in failing school districts. Parents should not have to send their children to failing schools, but funding cuts could force some cyber charters out of business, leaving parents with few or no options. The school funding proposal also neglects rural counties like Adams, which have smaller school districts and even smaller tax bases to make up for funding losses.

House Bill 2370 was recently approved in the House by a vote of 107-94, largely along party lines, and is now under consideration in the state Senate. I voted "no" on this bill for its \$1.1 billion annual price tag and for the many things it fails to provide.

SOLAR GROWTH

From my perspective, depending on the location of the installation, the view shed is dramatically affected if in a scenic area. Many tourists return and come to Adams County because its scenic rural character adds to the enjoyment of their visit. Will the continued growth of industrial solar arrays be an enjoyable tourist attraction? How will industrial solar arrays among preserved farmland enhance the scenic character of that area? I believe that the answer to the cumulative growth of solar is, it will adversely affect the health of our tourism industry.

It will present challenges for neighboring property owners: enhanced flooding, glare, loss of property values, noise, and soil and water contamination presence from damaged panels leaking toxic materials.

Industrial solar eliminates land from agricultural production. Associated industries are supported by the commodities produced on Adams County acreage. For example, CXS railroad traffic through Adams County exists primarily because of hauling agricultural products.

Industrial solar can only happen through governmental subsidies which Governor Shapiro has recently increased to incentivize more industrial solar. Is this what Adams County needs?

CYBERSECURITY IS NOT JUST IT'S RESPONSIBILITY ALONE


