

**Totem Pole Playhouse** Ryan Gibbs, Producing Artistic Director 717.575.3993 | rgibbs@totempoleplayhouse.org

#### Let's meet Ryan Gibbs with Totem Pole Playhouse!

Founded in 1950, Totem Pole Playhouse has earned a national reputation for providing fantastic professional theatre accessible to all. Each summer season, over 20,000 patrons from across the Mid-Atlantic states attend performances at the theater. This past May, Totem Pole Playhouse welcomed a new Producing Artistic Director to breathe new life into the theatre as they enter their 75<sup>th</sup> season.

"I have a long history with the playhouse as Director, Lighting Designer and Stage Manager," Ryan Gibbs said.

As the new Producing Artistic Director, Gibbs is responsible for supervising general operations, finding ways to engage with the audience, overseeing philanthropic development, choosing programming and hiring guest artists. Born in York County, Gibbs moved to New York City for fifteen years and now lives in Lancaster, PA and happily spends his summers in Caledonia State Park at Totem Pole Playhouse.

"Before this, I ran the Allenberry Playhouse in Boiling Springs, PA and worked on Broadway Shows and National Tours of such titles as *Wicked*, *Harry Potter and the Cursed Child*, *Rent* and *Mary Poppins*," Gibbs said.

Each season, between Memorial and Labor Day, the theater produces six titles and one holiday show. They usually select well-known comedies, murder mysteries, and Broadwaystyle musicals. This year two shows stand out in Gibbs' mind.

"We staged a truly spectacular production of *Tuesdays* with Morrie that I hold dear," he said, "However, much like how we feel about our children, we take immense pride in and love all of our shows. Our run of *Jersey Boys* was a standout success, with nearly every performance sold out."

Getting to curate entertainment for the community is a challenge and a joy that Gibbs loves about his job. Describing

that Totem Pole is more than just a venue, but a community gathering spot that offers a refreshing experience that fosters connections among people.

"Each day we open our doors, everyone involved—the actors, the audience, the staff, and the ushers—experiences a unique moment in time together," Gibbs expressed. "It's a fleeting snapshot that we all share, never to be the same again."

Sharing the love of community theater is important to not only Gibbs, but also the mission of the theater as well. With that in mind, Totem Pole Playhouse offers three performances, each year, to Adams County students at little or no cost.

"This initiative is part of our broader commitment to giving back to the local community," Gibbs explained. "By making these shows accessible, we aim to inspire and engage young minds, fostering a love for the arts."

Through these efforts, they provide the community with top-tier entertainment while also providing support and enriching the lives of the next generation.

# 911 TEXT SERVICE NOW AVAILABLE IN ALL COUNTIES REPRESENTATIVE DAN MOUL

The Pennsylvania Emergency Management Agency (PEMA) announced that it is now possible to text 911 in any county across the Commonwealth. Simply type 911 in the address field of a new text. Then provide as much detail as possible about your location and emergency.

Texting 911 is ideal for those with hearing or speech disabilities or in situations when it's impossible or unsafe to talk. PEMA still recommends calling, when possible, as it provides background sounds and context clues to aid operators and emergency responders.

Just as with a voice call, the 911 telecommunicator will ask questions about your emergency – confirming your location, the people involved, and any other details that are important to responders. Texting conversations take time, so please be patient and be as clear and concise as possible.

A text or data plan is required to place a text to 911.

Text-to-911 conversations cannot include more than one person.

Do not use abbreviations or emojis.

While voice calls occur in real-time, texts do not. They may be delayed, get out of order, or not be received at all. Call when possible. Finally, location information is crucial! Text signals are limited to the cell tower your cell phone is communicating through. A 911 telecommunicator won't automatically know where you are.

# THE INTERNET IS SCARY

I'm in my mid-30s. Growing up I was told never to share my personal information on the internet. Don't immediately believe what people share. Double check links and information. Did I always listen? Of course not! But it did set a foundation for how I view online content today.

Does anyone remember "rickrolling"? If not, it was an internet prank where someone would trick you into clicking a link that unexpectedly led to the music

video for Rick Astley's "Never Gonna Give You Up." What a foresight into practicing security awareness! This meme had an entire generation second guessing the links they may have blindly clicked before.

With the rise of social media, people have become lackadaisical about the information they both

share and read. Unfortunately, bad actors love when you do this. You may unknowingly share false content or maybe you comment on something you know is incorrect – which pushes the content higher for more people to see. Not only that, but with AI blindly gathering information, AI can now pretend to be anyone and everyone.

AI can take your voice and image and create life-like videos or voice overs. The FTC calls this "voice-cloning phishing scams". Victims receive calls using a cloned voice from a panicked friend or relative demanding money for their "dire" situation. Businesses are also targets. Some companies lost hundreds of thousands of dollars due to this scam. If you find yourself receiving a call like this – hang up and call the person directly to verify.

Not only can you, your friends, family, or co-workers become targets – so can celebrities and

politicians. With it being an election year, "deepfakes" are on the rise. Deepfakes are highly realistic, AIgenerated content that manipulates media to make it appear as though someone is saying or doing something they never actually did.

Sadly, social media giants such as Facebook have openly admitted they purposely show you negative and fake content to drive engagement. Knowing this, bad actors create spam pages or "click bait" just to draw in

your attention. Don't fall for it! Would the person in the video or image really do that or do you wish they did or didn't?

The internet doesn't have to be scary. Here are some tips to up your security game. Lock your social media profiles to private and enable multifactor authentication on everything. Don't share information you wouldn't want the whole world to know. Double check the information you're viewing; is it too good to be true or

make you angry? Always think before you click and never think you won't become a victim of a phishing scam!

Additionally, it's important to share security awareness with your friends, family, and co-workers. Make sure to remind the kids in your life to never share their personal information online.

October begins Cybersecurity Awareness Month, an annual campaign to boost the importance of staying safe online. You can visit staysafeonline.org for more great security awareness tips. Stay safe!




