Local Environmental Stewards Recognized

Each year, the Gettysburg Adams Chamber of Commerce presents an Environmental Stewardship Award to an entity (or in this case two) whose business practices involve exemplary environmental actions. These actions may involve water or energy conservation, waste reduction and recycling efforts or a host of other environmental stewardship efforts. The 2010 award recipients were recognized at the Chamber's General Membership Breakfast on February 18.

Gettysburg Eddie's was recognized for incorporating environmentally sustainable principles and standards into everyday operations. In March 2009, Gettysburg Eddie's became the fifth restaurant in Pennsylvania and only restaurant in Adams County to become a Certified Green Restaurant by the Green Restaurant Association (GRA). As the industry expert, GRA works closely with the restaurant to provide real and actionable solutions. A few examples of the environmentally sustainable principles that owner Bill Wills and his staff have incorporated include:

- Conservation of gas, electric and water through the use of GRA-approved aerators, bathroom fixtures, lighting motion sensors and programmable thermostats, leading to long-term economic vitality.
- The use of as many sustainable products that are available, including the use of rice, soybean and potato-based biodegradable products, thus replacing the products traditionally used by most of the restaurant industry that are harmful to the environment and deplete our natural resource base (primarily through the use of petroleum-based products).
- Utilizing Valley Proteins service out of Winchester, Virginia for removal and recycling of the fryer oil, turning it into biodiesel fuel.

The Gettysburg Foundation was also recognized for its extensive environmental programs, as the Foundation was challenged to replace an existing facility at a new location and did so with minimum impact to the environment and view of the battlefield location. The Museum and Visitor Center received a Gold LEED certification, the one and only in Pennsylvania and the fourth museum to achieve such certification in the nation. The LEED certification process is constructed to minimize environmental impact of the construction project from construction through operation. A few examples of the environmentally sustainable principles that have been incorporated include:

- A Geothermal well system for energy conservation and management, which reduces electricity demand and associated pollution emissions.
- Renewable Energy Credits - they are an environmental commodity that represents added value, environmental benefits and costs of renewable energy above conventional methods of producing electricity.
- Stormwater management at the project site involved wetlands mitigation and wetlands construction. Parking lot stormwater runoff is initially directed to stormwater storage beneath the parking lot prior to eventual discharge to one of two wetland areas (nearly 2 acres). This dual use of the parking area minimized surface area, and especially surface area clearing requirements.

Congratulations to both of these entities for helping to keep Adams County a beautiful and safe community to live in.

"Totaled," an exhibit of abstract watercolors by Gettysburg artist Adrian Sauers, is featured through March 4 in the gallery hallway at the Gettysburg Campus of HACC, Central Pennsylvania's Community College. Sauers' works captures the textures and colors in unexpected objects such as rusted metal fence posts, stacks of wooden boards and junked automobiles. A concurrent exhibit in recognition of national Black History Month highlights portraits and stories of African women by Adams County artist Caroline Jones.

Older adults and their families don't always prepare for the consequences of aging. They think it won't happen to them, right? Research has revealed that an inability for sibling caregivers to work together leaves the bulk of caregiving to one caregiver in 43 percent of all cases.
